Let us pray, using the words from the Preamble of the United Nations Charter,

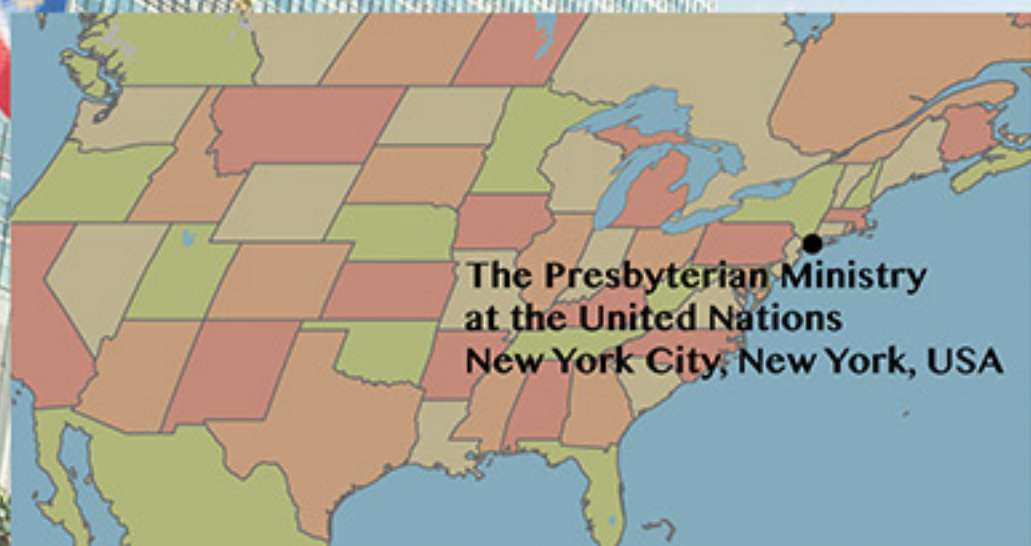
God of Grace, we pray:
